Three Politicians Who Affected Society in Quebec

Quebec has changed in many significant ways. How did the policies of the politicians In Quebec during the 1960s1970s affect Quebec? There were similarities and differences in the politician's ideology and the way they brought to light
their ideology. The Three politicians are Jean Lesage, Lester Pearson, and Pierre Trudeau. The three politicians believed in the
same ideologies. For instance, Lesage started and promoted the quiet revolution and so did Trudeau. The Quiet Revolution
was a period of intense social change. The quiet revolution was the change from Duplessis regime which had been
characterized by isolation and traditionism. In addition, the three politicians believed in developing Quebec. For example,
Pearson and Trudeau didn't want separatism in Quebec because they wanted Quebec to be party of Canada. In summary, three
politicians had a similar idea on how things should be and ran in Quebec.

The three politicians had different personalities and they followed their ideologies differently. First of all Jean Lesage was separatist and believed in a more modernize society. On the other hand, Pearson and Trudeau were fredalists. Jean Lesage was Prime Minister of Quebec 1960-1966. Jean Lesage's changes were focused on the area of energy, and education. His changes were fast and unexpected because he did not conform the people or explain them what he was doing. Unlike the other politicians who cooperated with the people. For instance, he started the hydro company and made hydroelectricity available in Quebec. Moreover, he established different education systems. He started English courses in schools, and colleges in sciences and industry Furthermore, Lester Pearson started by having a goal for Canada. He wanted English Canadians to be aware of the fear in Quebec that the Quebeckers might lose their language and culture. For example, Expo 67 in Montreal all provinces in Canada united and celebrated the provinces of Canada. There was a problem when on the visit of French president Charles de Gaulle came and promoted separatism by saying the Quebec separatist slogan. Pearson and English Canadians weren't happy about that. Of course, Pearson wanted the French to feel part of Canada. Finally, Pierre Trudeau in 1968 became Prime minister in Quebec when Pearson retired. Trudeau was original, distinct, and had great style. He was a fluent bilingual. The francophone and Anglophone liked and supported him. Trudeau focused on equal society. Trudeau's goal was for Quebeckers was to have equal opportunity to develop and improve. He made sure that hospital insurance and Medicare were available. As you can see, even though the three politicians had same ideology they focused on different things.

Politicians of Canada

Also he introduce Canada's new flag, the Maple Leaf as symbol of unity to all Canadians. Therefore Lester Pearson also helped Quebec society and made Quebecers feel that they are part of Canada.

Pierre Trudeau is third politician that made Quebec part of Canada in 1960-1970. He is one of the most popular politician in Canada. Trudeau was a strong federalist and was bilingual. Therefore both Anglophone and francophone supported him. His ideologies such as "Just society" made Canada united which means everyone would have equal opportunities. In addition, the laws he made where support by both Anglophone and francophone. For example, he introduced new immigration law and also declared Canada as a multicultural and bilingual country. This helped French Canadian to communicate the government in their own language. These laws are still in use, therefore Trudeau helped Canada to be united.

To conclude Lesage, Pearson and Trudeau believed in federalism and followed the same ideology (making Canada united).
